June	26	1937	<p>J. L. B. entered hospital at Twin Falls, having an infected finger, first finger on left hand, caused from cutting it with the mowing machine guard as he was fixing it June 18, 1937. He continued working till Friday noon, ^{June 25} we doctored hand as we had done at other times for similiar trouble but it did not improve as we hoped, became serious + Dr Hoffer of Hazelton ordered him to the Hospital. Bishop Little + wife + Weldon took us to Twin Falls ^{to Hospital} arriving there about 4:20 A.M. Sat. morning. The Dr had phoned for arrangements to receive him and the nurses were soon busy. The infection continually grew worse, spreading into the hand. Three different operations were performed in hopes of relieving the trouble. Dr Beymer of Twin Falls assisted Dr Hoffer. He suffered the most terrible pain, and was kept under opiates and hypodermics practically all the time till the end which came as a happy release to him at 9:30 A.M. Thursday July 1st 1937. Coroner Joseph P. Payne of Burley, of the Paine Mortuary had charge of the arrangements + care of body. Funeral was held in Twin Falls State Tabernacle on Sat. July 3 at 12 noon, The body shipped to Shelley Idaho for burial the next day.</p>
