

W. A. Richards Dies at Gooding

GOODING, July 29 — William Adams Richards, 63, retired farmer and sheep shearer, died at the Gooding hospital at noon today, following an illness of more than two years. He had been a patient in the hospital two weeks.

Born Aug. 5, 1880, at Parowan, Utah, he came to Idaho in 1904, pioneering on Camas prairie, filing a homestead claim in 1905.

He came to Gooding in 1928 upon retirement, and was prominent in activities of the LDS church.

Surviving is the widow, Mrs. Ann Richards; two daughters, Miss Ruth Richards, a civil service employe working at Kodiak, Alaska, and Mrs. Namoi Ellers, Gooding; two brothers, Joseph E., Salt Lake City, Utah, and Alma W., Los Angeles; three sisters, Mrs. Belle Tanner, Ogden, and Mrs. Columbia Tanner and Miss Catherine Richards, both of Salt Lake City. Two grandchildren also survive.

Tentative funeral arrangements have been set for Wednesday at 10 a. m. in the LDS church, Gooding, with Bishop R. L. Dixon in charge.
